Gyle Herman Peterson, 64, Fargo, died Saturday, December 1, in Sanford Medical Center.

Gyle was born August, 31, 1954 in Fargo, ND to Lyle M. and Shirley D. (Peterson) Peterson. He was born with Muscular Dystrophy and wasn't expected to live to be a teenager. He was home schooled through the 8th grade, but he continued to learn new things. Gyle was a go getter and was always finding ways to earn some money. He had a special computer he operated with his thumb.

Gyle wrote articles for the Fargo "Guide" magazine and even a manuscript. It was his way of communicating and keeping up with the happenings around him. Gyle enjoyed playing cards and going to Texan Hold "Em Tournaments. He enjoyed family and friends stopping by to visit. He really enjoyed his trip to Las Vegas with his caregivers.

After his parents passed, he continued to live in the family home with 24-hour caregivers. He loved decorating outside his home for Halloween and Christmas with his "girls" doing the work. He enjoyed seeing the kids in their costumes.

Gyle's caregivers meant so much to him and became his second family. They often came back to see him even when they moved on to other jobs.

Gyle is survived by his brother, Bob (Sylvia) Peterson; niece, Stacy Allen; great-niece, Brittany (Tony) and Maddie and Makenna Bogenreif all of Breckenridge, MN; aunts and uncles, Duane and Joanne Peterson, Jerry and Julie Peterson, Fargo; Nancy Walker, New Hope, MN and Janis Claus, Milnor, ND; many cousins, and Blanche Braasch, special family friend and "second Mom", West Fargo.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Lyle and Shirley Peterson and his sister, Diane; grandparents, Gilman and Ella Peterson and Herman and Edlin Peterson.

I met Gyle in 2012 through his Buy Sell Mania page, we didn't know it at the time that we were neighbor for 3 years prior to that we started talking and then I walked over to meet him in person, from that day we hit it off. We were both into social media selling sights and he talked me into becoming one of his admins to his page to help out, once it grew to a mere 40k members it got so big that we added several more admins to help out with the site, I stepped down as his head admin later on leaving it back to him and the other admins. I found out around that time that Gyle had resources in place to build him a deck in the front of his house so he could spend some time outside instead of being cooped up inside all the time, at the last minute those resources fell trough and in an Email to him stating they no long had the funding for the materials and labor to do his projects, Gyle got very depressed and wanted to give up. I stepped up and said, if you can some how come up with materials to build the deck I will find the help to get it done, at that time I helped him create a Go Fund Me account and with all the help from friends and strangers he managed to come up with the funds for the materials. With the help of Darren Mogck a couple of his staff workers and even a couple members from his Buy Sell page we managed to get the frame work done in just a couple of days, after that we spent evenings and weekends working on the deck. Gyles goal was to have the deck finished by his 60th Birthday. I put the last screw in the hand rail 10 minutes before his party started LOL, We cut it close but made it in time. A year after that it was time to talk about building a room in the house that was 100% handicap accessible. His goal for that was to have it finished ASAP as his dad Lyle was ill with cancer, a few weeks went by and we got started but had to put the project on hold for a couple of weeks as Lyle fell to ill to have the work done and we didn't get to finish before he passed. A couple weeks went by and again with the help of a couple of his staff members at the time we went to work and got his room finished which he has been able to enjoy until his passing, We became very close friends and I'm going to miss the weekly text messages asking me to come over and help him with something around the house. RIP My Friend and Neighbor. Will will never be forgotten.
